



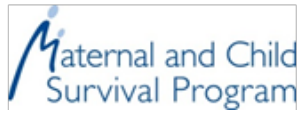

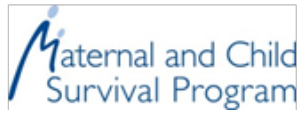
Meeting Objectives:
